Their diverse crop rotation consists of corn, oats, wheat, canola, soybeans, peas, and cover crops such as turnips and radishes. In addition to their crop land the Fannik's run a herd of Hereford Angus cow-calf operation. They incorporate a minimum till one pass seeding system that allows them to minimize compaction. The Fannik's utilize variable rate technology to properly place their fertilizer/NH3 where it is most efficiently used. They also incorporate cover crops such as turnips and radishes to prolong the health of their soil profile and assist their livestock operation with fall grazing. Some of their long term goals are to further increase the efficiencies of their current soil profile and utilize practices that encourage it's prolonged health, to lay the foundation for the next generation in their family farm/ranch operation to be successful, and to continue to seek practice that will improve our farm's profitability for the future generations.
